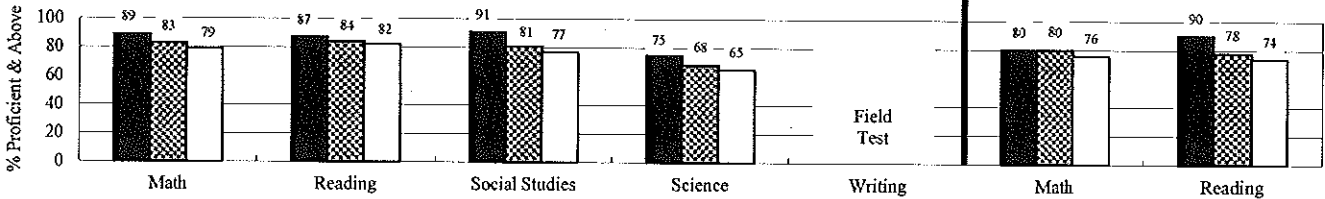
3rd Grade Tests*



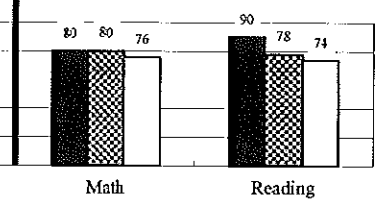
4th Grade Tests*



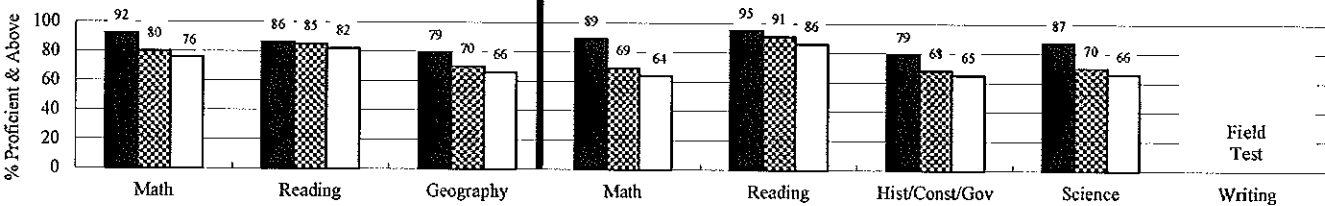

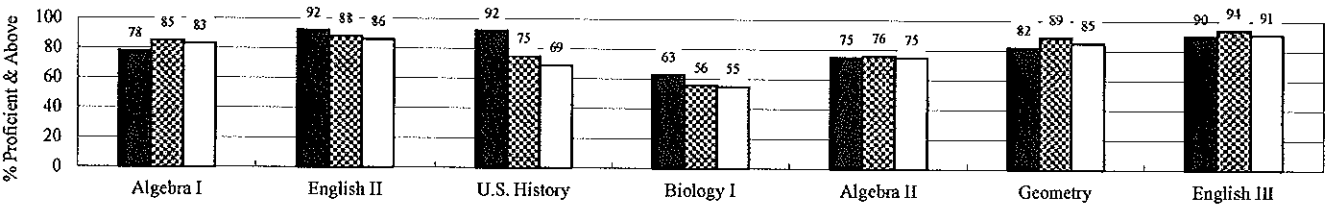

% of Students Scoring Proficient and Above by Grade and Subject

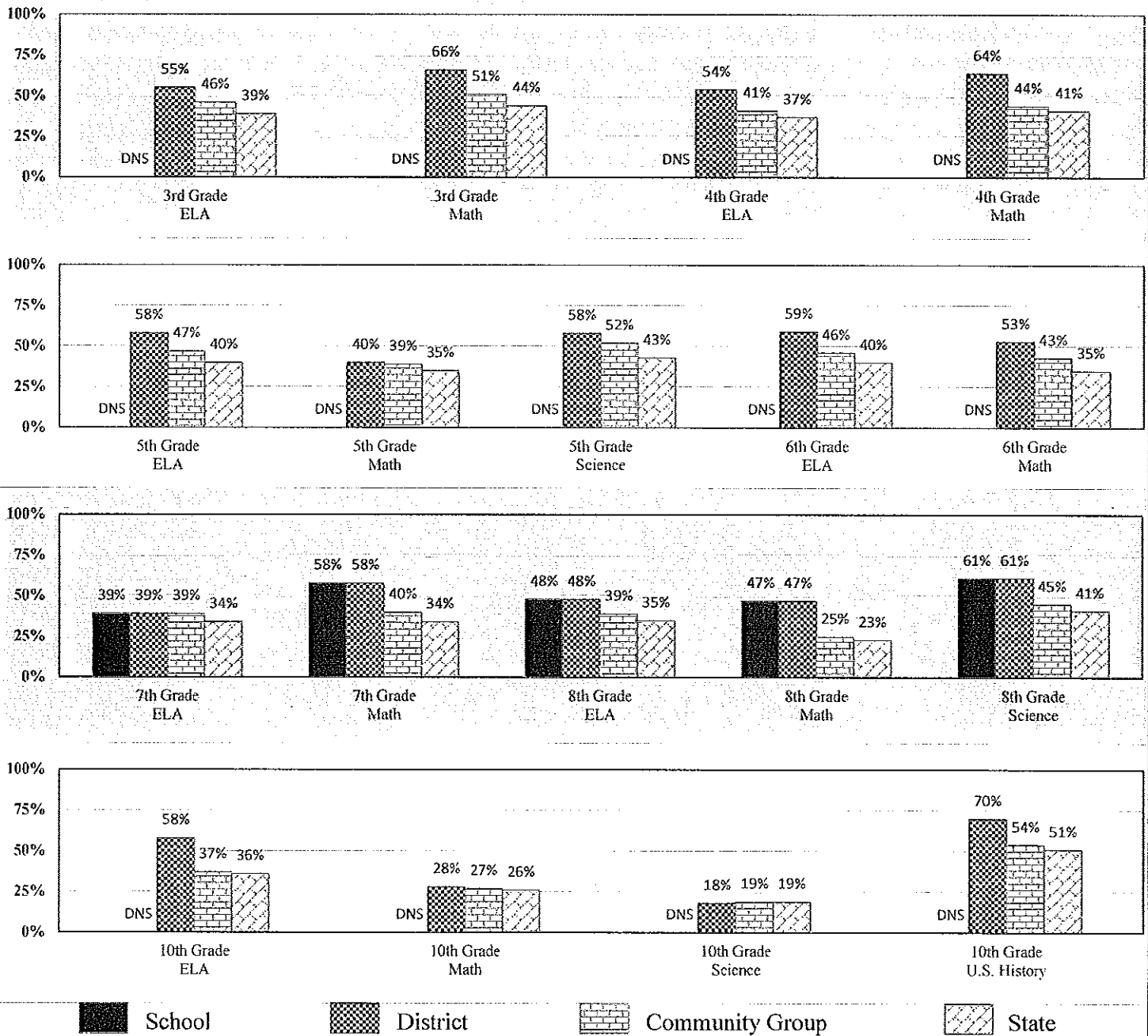
